Taste test: Mike's Sweet Creamy Mustards

The scoop: Originally Mike Washburne tweaked a favorite family mustard recipe and made it only for relatives and friends. Lucky for us, Washburne started making it commercially in 2004. The original is the Sweet Creamy Mustard. A cherry variety and lemon dill also are available. The character drawing on the label is that of Washburne.

The taste: The original is sweet yet tangy. It's great as a dip for pretzels or crackers and is divine as a spread. The lemon dill and the cherry varieties are also perfect for dipping and, used as a spread, are good matches with grilled chicken or fish.
